Studio Electives 6 credits
Courses should provide hands-on experiences that advance skills applied in creative research or to understand and incorporate experimental or applied practices.

Interdisciplinary Electives 6 credits
Courses which are based on studying and interacting within another disciplines beyond design.

Theory, History, Criticism Electives 9 credits
Courses with strong emphasis on historiography and analytical methodologies, as well as with the philosophical, political, and material contexts for works related to design, animation, or interactive media and specific thesis topics.

*AAEP 7795/7725 is recommended but not required.

Elective courses may be taken in any order, and within Design or in other departments or centers.

Students on GTA/GRA appointments must be enrolled for a minimum of 8 credits in AU and SP semesters and 4 credits in SU semester. A 25% appointment is 4 credits and 2 credits respectively.
